Day 1 - Hagerstown, Maryland - A day of travel takes us through the beautiful mountains of West Virginia and the "Old Line State" of Maryland, where we overnight in Hagerstown.

Day 2 - Gettysburg Film, Cyclorama, and Museum – Guided Battlefield Tour - After an included breakfast, we continue to the historic city of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, the site of the most decisive battle of the Civil War. We start our visit with a Film, Cyclorama, and Museum Experience at Gettysburg National Military Park Museum and Visitors Center. We have included lunch this afternoon. Next, we meet our step on guide for a tour of the Gettysburg Battlefield. The historic battlefield has been restored through preservation efforts to look much like it did in 1863. We spend two nights in Gettysburg.

Day 3 - Shriver House Museum – Jennie Wade House – Devil's Den – Gettysburg National Cemetery – Kentucky State Monument - After an included breakfast, we visit the Shriver House Museum. Our guide in historic costume takes us on a tour through the restored 1860 Shriver home, explaining what life was like before, during, and after the Civil War. We will have lunch on our own in downtown Gettysburg before our visit to the Jennie Wade House, the home of the only civilian killed during the Battle of Gettysburg. Next, we drive to Devil's Den for a self-guided tour of the grounds. This rock formation, dominated by large boulders, was the site of some of the fiercest fighting during the second day of the battle. This evening, we

will take a walking tour through the cemetery where Abraham Lincoln addressed the citizens of Gettysburg. We will see the Kentucky State Monument. Erected in 1975 by the state of Kentucky, this memorial commemorates Lincoln's address at the dedication ceremony. Overnight same hotel.

Day 4 - Amish Countryside Tour – "Moses" at Sight & Sound – Lancaster, Pennsylvania - After an included breakfast, we travel to the heart of the Amish country, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. We'll take a guided tour of the Amish countryside with a local step on guide. An Amish lunch is included this afternoon. Afterwards, we travel to the beautiful Sight & Sound Theater to experience the classic story of "Moses." The magnitude of this production is unbelievable. Not only will you be completely immersed in the spectacular, epic events of the story, but you will experience the humanity of Moses and the children of Israel as they struggle for faith, freedom, and belonging. We overnight in Lancaster.

Day 5 - Longwood Gardens – Hagerstown, Maryland - After an included breakfast, we make our way to Kennett Square, Pennsylvania, where we tour magnificent Longwood Gardens. Once the country estate of industrialist Pierre S. Dupont, Longwood is famous for its superb outdoor gardens, which include elaborate fountains, two lakes, woodlands, wildflowers, a formal rose garden, and greenhouses containing exotic tropical displays. We overnight in Hagerstown.

Day 6 - Home - After an included breakfast, we depart our hotel and return home with a variety of inspiring memories from our trip to Pennsylvania. **Meals: 5B, 2L, Shows: 1**

The Mid-Atlantic Coast is an incomparable national treasure. This region of the country has areas that time seems, in some ways, to have passed by. There are towns that look much as they did two centuries ago. Some people make their living much as their ancestors did, in places that truly evoke a bygone era.

Day 1 - Hagerstown, Maryland - A day of travel takes us through the beautiful mountains of West Virginia and the “Old Line State” of Maryland, where we overnight in Hagerstown.

Day 2 - Fort McHenry National Monument – B&O Railroad Museum – U.S. Naval Academy – Milford, Delaware - After an included breakfast, we take a step back into history at Baltimore’s Fort McHenry National Monument. The defense of the fort during the War of 1812 inspired Francis Scott Key to write “The Star-Spangled Banner.” Next, we visit the B&O Railroad Museum. Here the magic and adventure of railroading comes alive, allowing us to see, touch, hear, and explore the most important railroad collection in America. A boxed lunch is included at the museum. This afternoon, we take a guided tour of the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. Our hotel accommodations for the next two nights will be in Milford, Delaware.

Day 3 - Winterthur Museum – Cape May Trolley Tour - After an included breakfast, we visit the Winterthur Museum in Wilmington, Delaware. Founded by Henry Francis du Pont, it is our nation’s premier museum of American decorative arts, reflecting both early Americana

and the du Pont family’s life here. Its 60-acre naturalistic garden is among best in the nation. Next, we travel to Cape May, New Jersey, where our narrated trolley tour of “America’s Oldest Seashore Resort” will highlight its rich history and many examples of Victorian architecture. After dinner on our own, we will board the Cape May and Lewes Ferry for a 90-minute trip across the Delaware Bay. Overnight in Milford.

Day 4 - Atlantic Coast – Ocean City Boardwalk – Virginia Beach - After an included breakfast, we drive along the Atlantic Coast of Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia. This afternoon, we stop at the famous Boardwalk of Ocean City, Maryland. We’ll have lunch on our own and time to enjoy some of the amusements that the boardwalk has to offer. Continuing south, we cross the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel, a seventeen-mile engineering marvel that showcases the mighty surge of the Atlantic Ocean and the beauty of the Chesapeake Bay. Next, we check into our oceanfront hotel, located on Virginia Beach, where we overnight two nights. The rest of the day will be at your leisure to stroll the beach or swim in the pool.

Day 5 - Douglas MacArthur Memorial – Nauticus Museum – USS Wisconsin - After an included breakfast, we visit the Douglas MacArthur Memorial, a fascinating tribute to the legendary five-star general who became famous for commanding the Allied Forces in the Pacific during World War II. We spend this afternoon exploring Nauticus Museum and the USS Wisconsin Battleship from World War II. Nauticus

is a contemporary museum that uses the natural setting of Norfolk’s harbor to showcase global maritime commerce and the world’s largest navy. Dinner is included this evening. Overnight same hotel.

Day 6 - Shirley Plantation – Virginia State Capitol – Charlottesville - After an included breakfast, we travel up the James River to Virginia’s first plantation. Founded in 1613, only six years after the first permanent English settlement at Jamestown, Shirley Plantation offers the story of eleven generations of family who continue to own and operate this grand colonial plantation. The guided tour of the Great House highlights original family furnishings, portraits, silver, and hand-carved woodwork. Several features such as the “Flying Staircase” and the Queen Anne forecourt are the only remaining examples in North America of this architectural style. This afternoon, we will visit Virginia’s State Capitol. Since 1788, it has been home to the oldest legislature continuously operating in the Western Hemisphere. We overnight in Charlottesville, Virginia.

Day 7 - Tamarack – Home - After an included breakfast, we depart for home. We will stop for lunch on our own and shopping at Tamarack, West Virginia’s unique craft center. We make our way home this afternoon with great memories of the Chesapeake Bay and Mid-Atlantic Coast.

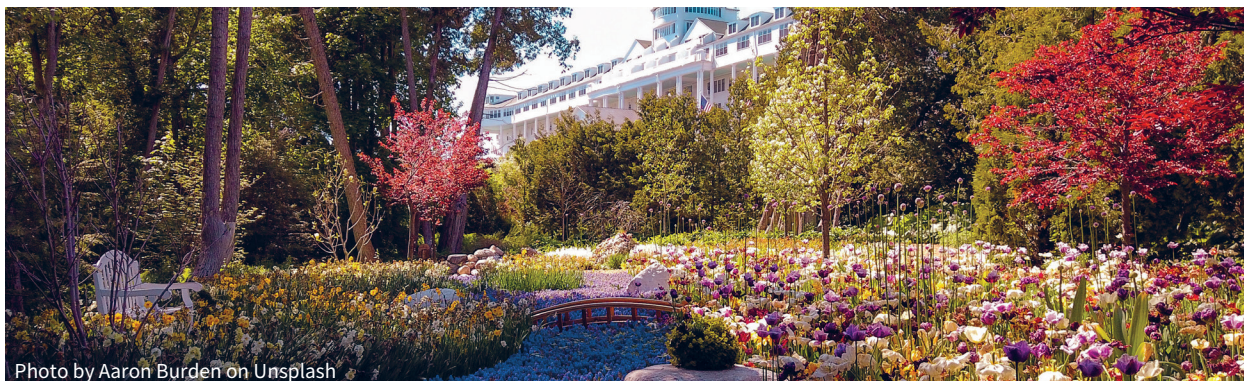

Day 1 - Niagara Falls, Ontario - Today we drive north across Ohio, Pennsylvania, and New York State. We cross the Canadian Border and arrive at our hotel about sundown. Our hotel accommodations for the next three nights will be in Niagara Falls, Ontario.

Day 2 - Canadian Falls & Table Rock – Niagara’s Fury – SkyWheel – Journey Behind the Falls – Elements Restaurant - After an included breakfast, a local guide will step aboard our coach and provide an exciting tour of the Table Rock area. Table Rock Centre is the heart of Niagara Parks, where every year over eight million visitors stand close to the thundering water rushing over the brink of Horseshoe Falls! This afternoon, we visit Niagara’s newest attraction, Niagara’s Fury. This 4D motion theater brings to life the ancient story of Niagara Falls in this multi-sensory presentation. Next, we ride the thrilling Niagara SkyWheel. Climate controlled gondolas soar 175 feet above Niagara for memorable views of the Horseshoe and American Falls, the Niagara River, and other landmarks. After lunch on our own, we get an exciting, close-up view of this great natural wonder, as we experience Journey Behind the Falls. The tour begins with an elevator ride down to the bottom of the Horseshoe Falls. There are two observation decks and two portals located directly behind the Falls. You’ll be able to stand behind the roaring curtain of water as one fifth of the world’s freshwater thunders past you. Tonight, we have included dinner at the Elements Restaurant, overlooking the mighty

Niagara. What a view! What memories! Overnight same hotel.

Day 3 - Welland Canal – Lavender Farm – Niagara-on-the-Lake – Winery Tour and Tasting – Greg Frewin Dinner Theater - After an included breakfast, we stop at the Welland Canal, for a look at this great engineering feat. The canal is a series of 7 lift locks and one regulating lock and is a man-made waterway system to compensate for the 326.5 ft drop between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario. The locks can lift huge ships as if they were toys. Next, we visit a lavender farm where you’ll have the opportunity to purchase a wide variety of lavender products while we are here. Next, we stop for lunch and shopping at Niagara-on-the-Lake. This historic town captures attention with its Georgian and Victorian styled building, Waterfront Park, and the surrounding fields of grapevines. Afterwards, we have scheduled a winery tour and tasting – a great introduction to winemaking excellence. We make a stop at the Floral Clock for a photo before returning to our hotel. Tonight, we have included the popular Greg Frewin Dinner Show. Greg Frewin has appeared on the world’s top stages, such as the Flamingo Hilton, Caesar’s Palace, and the Tropicana in Las Vegas and has been featured in over 35 television shows worldwide. Overnight same hotel.

Day 1 - Hagerstown, Maryland - A day of travel takes us through the beautiful mountains of West Virginia and the “Old Line State” of Maryland, where we overnight in Hagerstown.

Day 2 - Hudson River Cruise – Albany, New York - After an included breakfast, we continue to Kingston, New York, where we will take a narrated sightseeing cruise of the Hudson River aboard *Rip Van Winkle II*. Our cruise sails back past historic lighthouses, waterfront mansions, and quaint villages surrounded by orchards and vineyards. We overnight in Albany.

Day 3 - Saratoga Springs – Lake George Luncheon Cruise – Prospect Mountain – Rutland, Vermont - After an included breakfast, we take a city tour of Saratoga Springs, New York with a local guide. This charming town is famous for horse racing and its natural mineral springs.

Next, we travel to Lake George, New York, where we will enjoy a luncheon cruise aboard *Lac du Saint Sacrement*. After an included lunch, relax and enjoy scenic views of the crystal-clear waters and mountain wilderness areas of Lake George. This afternoon, we travel to the summit of Prospect Mountain. The summit of the mountain has spectacular 100-mile views of the Adirondacks and Lake George. We continue our travels to the lovely Green Mountain State of Vermont, famed for its beautiful landscape. We overnight in Rutland.

Day 4 - Billings Farm – Woodstock Village – Quechee Gorge – Quechee Village - After an included breakfast, we are off to the Billings Farm Museum, for a look into 19th century rural Vermont life. We’ll tour this charming 1890 farmhouse and walk through the gardens. This

afternoon, we visit the picture-perfect village of Woodstock, where you will have time for lunch on own, shopping, or walking the covered bridge. Next, we visit Quechee Gorge, known as “Vermont’s Little Grand Canyon.” Formed after the ice age, this unusual gorge demonstrates nature’s power as the Ottauquechee River carved a swath through the Vermont hillsides. At nearby Quechee Village, we will have time for shopping at the Vermont Antique Mall and Country Store. We continue to our hotel in accommodations in New Hampshire for the next two nights. Dinner is included this evening.

Day 5 - Mount Washington Cog Railway – Kancamagus Scenic Highway – Café Lafayette Dinner Train - After an included breakfast, we ride the historic Mount Washington Cog Railway to the highest mountain peak in the Northeast. There will be time to explore the State Park after we reach the summit of the mountain. There will be time to explore the Cog Railway Museum and gift shop after we travel back down to the base of Mount Washington. This afternoon, we travel the scenic Kancamagus Highway, one of the most scenic routes in America. The “Kanc” as the locals call it, is officially the section of Route 112 that is both an attraction and a destination. This evening, we depart for the Café Lafayette Dinner Train. As an included dinner is served, period music keeps time with the rail’s rhythmic rumbling, punctuated by the wail of the engine’s whistle. Overnight same hotel.

Day 6 - Castle in the Clouds – Lake Winnepesaukee Scenic Railroad – Portland, Maine - After an included breakfast, we will tour Castle in the Clouds. This 5,200-acre mountain wilderness estate, high above Lake Winnepesaukee, offers breathtaking lake and mountain views. After an included lunch, we board Lake Winnepesaukee Scenic Railroad for a memorable excursion. We travel in restored vintage cars along New Hampshire’s largest lake with panoramic views and photo opportunities along the way. We continue to Portland, Maine, where we overnight two nights.

Day 7 - Harbor Cruise – Portland City Tour - After an included breakfast, we take a narrated cruise of Portland Harbor, Casco Bay, and picturesque Diamond Pass waterway. We sail

past historic lighthouses, lobster boats, quaint villages, and islands dotted with Victorian cottages. afternoon, we tour Maine’s largest city by the sea, Portland, with a local step on guide. You will see views of Longfellow’s boyhood home and sea captains’ homes as we drive through historic neighborhoods overlooking the islands of Casco Bay. We will enjoy a stop at Portland Head Lighthouse in Fort Williams Park. Overnight same hotel.

Day 8 - Mark Twain Home & Museum – West Haven, Connecticut - After an included breakfast, we travel to Hartford, Connecticut. Here, the history of another era awaits us at the Mark Twain Home & Museum. We will tour the meticulously restored home and learn about the author’s legacy. We overnight in West Haven.

Day 9 - Hershey Chocolate World – Hagerstown, Maryland - After an included breakfast, we travel through New York State and New Jersey, making our way back into Pennsylvania. This afternoon, we stop at Hershey Chocolate World in Hershey, Pennsylvania. We will take a simulated chocolate factory ride to see how a cocoa bean becomes a chocolate bar. 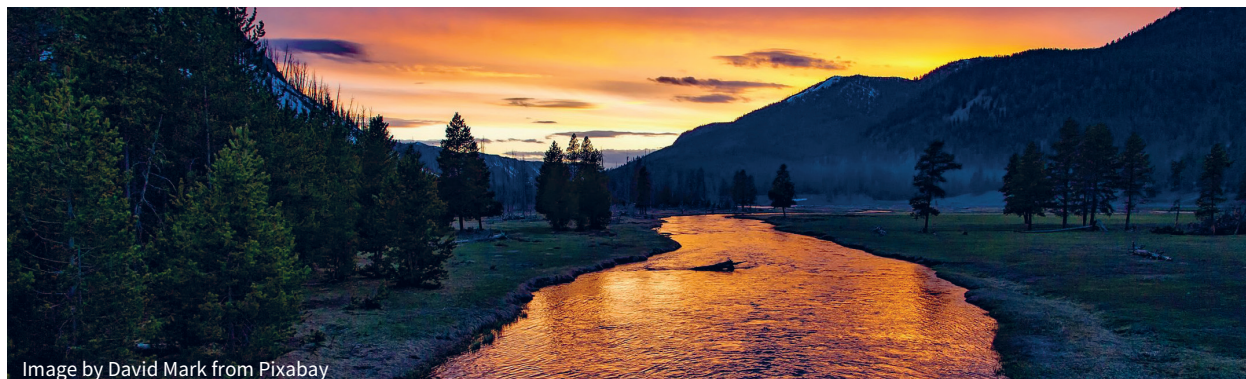

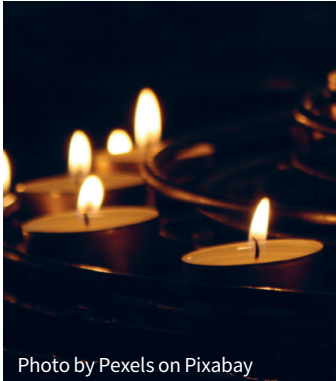
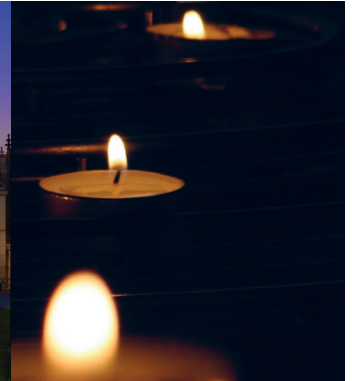

GENERAL INFORMATION & TOUR CONDITIONS

Please read carefully before signing up for a tour.
Your reservation constitutes acceptance of our policies.

TOUR COST INCLUDES: A trip with Jefferson Tours and Charters includes transportation, lodging, local guides, admission fees for all sightseeing included in the itinerary, dining rooms tips for meals included in the itinerary, and the services of a professional Motorcoach Driver and Tour Director. Prices are per person, based on double occupancy. All tour prices are based on rates known at the time our catalog is printed and expected to be in effect at the time of departure. They are subject to increase if such rates change prior to departure.

NOT INCLUDED IN YOUR TOUR COST: Meals and tips other than those specified in the itinerary, maids, valet and laundry service, phone calls, room service, alcoholic beverages, and items of a personal nature. Gratuities for local step on guides and the Tour Director and Driver are not included. A recommended gratuity is \$6.00 per day, per passenger for the Tour Director and \$6.00 per day, per passenger for the Driver. Gratuities should be extended on an individual basis, not by passing a bag around as a group. Gratuities for international tours and cruises are not included. You will be given guidelines for recommended tipping in your final documents for all international tours and cruises.

RESERVATIONS: We encourage you to make reservations as early as possible. A limited number of people can be accommodated on our motorcoaches. In addition, hotel reservations and ticketing are finalized 90, 60, or 30 days prior to the dates of service.

DEPOSITS: Balance is due within five days of receipt of balance statement and itinerary.

LATE BOOKINGS: Our tour bookings are normally finalized 45 days prior to departure (with a few exceptions). There are some tours that we can still add on to after it has been finalized. We are happy to include you with the tour if there is availability. In these situations, we must receive full payment with your reservation, plus a late booking fee of \$25 per person. Unfortunately, late bookings can also bring about tour increases, which Jefferson Tours and Charters cannot control. Increases can occur in any tour component that is booked late, such as flights, hotels, cruises, and event ticketing. Should these prices increase, all information will be made available to the client and Jefferson Tours and Charters will receive client approval prior to payment.

CANCELLATION OF OUR TOURS: Please help us avoid canceling our tours prematurely. We have made reservations for hotels, attractions, and other suppliers that require contracts and deadlines for deposits and cancellation. Some of these are 90, 60, or 30 days prior to the date of service. If you are interested in a tour, please book as soon as possible. Waiting too late runs the risk of us having to cancel the tour due to lack of passengers.

SAFETY MEASURES: At Jefferson Tours and Charters, the health and safety of our passengers and staff members is priority number one. We are implementing the strictest measures possible to create a hygienic, safe, and comfortable environment for our passengers. These measures include disinfecting and sanitizing areas of frequent contact such as handholds, restroom areas, armrests, entry areas, and surfaces in all vehicles during and after trips.

ROOMMATES: Each person making a reservation is responsible for finding their own roommate. When confirming your reservation for a tour, you should inform us if you have a roommate. Persons making a reservation without a designated roommate will be billed for the single rate. If either you or Jefferson Tours and Charters finds an acceptable person to share room costs, the cost of the tour will be reduced to the double rate and monies, if due, will be refunded to you. If a single room must

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be assigned because your roommate cancels (even at the last minute or while on tour), we must out of necessity, charge you the additional cost since the hotels make no allowances. If you prefer to have the privacy of your own room, you may do so for an additional charge as noted in our single price. The single rate does not include two seats on the motorcoach.

PICK UP LOCATIONS: In order to make your tour departure as convenient as possible, we pick up for our tours at the Jefferson Tours and Charters Office in Louisville; the Radisson Hotel in Clarksville, Indiana; the Wal-Mart in Frankfort; and the Marriott Griffin Gate Resort in Lexington. For groups of 20 or more, we will pick up at the location of your choice in any of our departure cities. For group pick-ups in locations other than our regular cities, there will be an additional cost per person. When making your reservation, it is important to give the correct departure location. No changes in pick up locations will be accepted after the itineraries are mailed, as departure timetables are established at that time.

LUGGAGE: For your convenience and to expedite movement, each tour participant is allowed one (1) large suitcase, not to exceed 22 x 10 x 30 inches in size and not to exceed 45 lbs. in weight. You must weigh and measure your bag after finishing your packing. In addition, each tour participant is allowed one (1) carry-on piece of luggage (such as an overnight case or similar small bag) that you handle or carry-on yourself. This carry-on bag must remain in your possession while traveling. Please note that due to limited storage space, we are unable to accept luggage that exceeds that specified size or weight limitation. Although every precaution will be taken to protect your belongings, Jefferson Tours and Charters cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to baggage or belongings. We strongly recommend that you insure your baggage before leaving home. Please note that concealed weapons, or weapons of any kind are not allowed on the motorcoach or in the luggage compartments.

CLOTHING: We suggest that you travel as light as possible. Casual attire in wash and wear fabrics travel best. Slacks are very acceptable for ladies and sport shirts for gentlemen. Dress-up clothes are necessary only for specific occasions listed in the itinerary. Don't forget your umbrella or raincoat in case of showers. You should always take a sweater or jacket to use on the coach and comfortable walking shoes are a must for any tour.

GROUP COURTESIES: Please be mindful of your fellow passengers and our staff. Group travel is a wonderful alternative to individual travel. We seek to provide a safe, clean environment for all of our travelers. It takes everyone in the group to make for a good tour. We ask that everyone be kind and courteous and keep on schedule. Please listen carefully to the Tour Director and/or Local Guide for instructions. We ask that everyone be able to keep up with the group. We reserve the right to refuse or discharge anyone we feel would be disruptive to the trip or harmful to themselves or others.

MEDICINES: If you are taking prescription medicines, be sure to take enough to last the duration of the tour. Sometimes it is very difficult to get a prescription refilled while in route. We highly recommend that you carry all medications in your purse, pocket, or in your carry-on, not in your large suitcase. It would be wise to have in your possession a list of all medications you are currently taking in case of an emergency. The coaches are not equipped to store medications that need refrigeration.

PHYSICAL DISABILITIES: Any disability requiring special attention or treatment, or hotel accommodations should be reported to Jefferson Tours and Charters when the reservation is made. We will request but cannot guarantee a handicapped room. Foldable wheelchairs and walkers are allowed on the tour, but must be stored in the luggage bays underneath the motorcoach. Wheelchairs and walkers are not provided by Jefferson Tours and Charters. Passengers intending to bring a foldable wheelchair or walker should notify Jefferson Tours and Charters at least 24 hours prior to departure. Unfortunately, the driver is unable to provide individual assistance to guests for walking, wheelchairs, or other personal needs. Travelers needing assistance must be accompanied by an able companion who can assist them. Some of our tours include attractions at high elevations; please

consult your physician about possible health effects.

DELUXE MOTORCOACHES: Jefferson Tours and Charters uses only the most modern deluxe motorcoaches available. They are climate-controlled, have comfortable reclining seats, footrests, overhead storage racks, restrooms, public address systems, and large viewing windows. All of our motorcoaches have video systems for your added touring pleasure. We always try to take the most popular and scenic routes so that travel itself becomes an enjoyable part of your vacation. There is never any overnight traveling. All passengers are insured while traveling aboard Jefferson Tours' motorcoaches.

SEAT ROTATION: In order that everyone can enjoy a variety of views and have exposure to meeting other people on the tours, we rotate seats daily in a clockwise direction on all multiple day trips. One of the front seats is reserved for the Tour Director and will not rotate. In order not to show partiality among passengers, there can be no exceptions to our seating plan. **Please note that this policy is subject to change due to social distancing procedures and new safety precautions.**

COMPREHENSIVE ITINERARIES: Jefferson Tours and Charters researches and plans each itinerary to include the "must see" sights of a given area as well as the little known, off the beaten path places that become the most memorable part of your experience. We try to ensure that you have an exciting, fun, educational, and the most enjoyable travel experience you have ever had. Jefferson Tours and Charters reserves the right to change or modify the itinerary in order to provide a smooth operation and ensure a successful tour. **Should an attraction become unavailable during the year, we will substitute one of equal or better value. Occasionally an attraction will be changed for the sole purpose of improving the tour.**

PROOF OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP:

- **Photo I.D.** – (such as a driver's license) is a necessity on any trip.
- **Passport** – A valid passport is required to enter Canada. A driver's license is no longer acceptable. Grandparents traveling into Canada with children must bring notarized written documentation of permission from custodial parent.
- **Real I.D.** – Beginning May 3, 2023, every air traveler 18 years of age and older will need a REAL I.D. compliant driver's license or identification card, state-issued enhanced driver's license, or another TSA-acceptable form of identification at airport security checkpoints for domestic air travel. A REAL I.D. can be obtained at your local DMV.

CANADIAN COVID-19 TRAVEL INFORMATION: Jefferson Tours and Charters continues to monitor travel restrictions closely, especially when it comes to travel into Canada. While information is subject to change, as of August 22, 2022, full vaccination is required for all travel into and out of Canada. A negative test will not be accepted unless the traveler is eligible for an exemption, such as a medical inability to be vaccinated.

To qualify as a fully vaccinated traveler to Canada, you must:

- 1.) Have received two doses of a vaccine accepted for travel, a mix of two accepted vaccines or one dose of the Janssen/Johnson & Johnson vaccine.
- 2.) Have received your second dose at least 14 calendar days before entry to Canada.
- 3.) Have no symptoms or signs of COVID-19.
- 4.) Follow pre-entry requirements, including submitting your travel information and proof of vaccination to the ArriveCAN portal.

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Testing is no longer required for vaccinated individuals or for young children under the age of five. However, if you are traveling with a youth aged five or older who is unvaccinated (or partially vaccinated), you must instead provide a negative test. Acceptable tests include antigen tests taken within one calendar day or molecular tests (such as PCR) taken within 72 hours before your scheduled flight or entry to Canada by land or water. Although unvaccinated children may provide a negative test in lieu of vaccination, adults don't have this same option. United States citizens traveling to Canada for tourism or business purposes must be fully vaccinated. Exceptions are only made under special circumstances. Those driving across the border do not need to test before returning to the United States. It's important to remember that this situation is developing, and new restrictions could be put in place by the Canadian government at any time

WAITING LISTS: We take waiting lists on all tours, since we do have frequent cancellations. If the tour you request is filled, then we recommend that you sign up on our waiting list. As soon as a vacancy occurs, you will be notified that you are confirmed on the tour. All vacancies will be filled from the waiting list in the order in which they were received.

QUALITY ACCOMMODATIONS: Hotels are selected and continually monitored for their location, comfort, hospitality, and style. Careful planning, research, and experience are woven into the choice of each hotel. We maintain tight quality control on all our lodging accommodations so that your overnight stays will be an enjoyable part of your tour. **Please note that most hotels have implemented a 100% non-smoking environment and charge a cleaning fee for smoking in a non-smoking room. We will send in your special requests on our rooming list to the hotel, for example, adjacent rooms, low floors, etc. However, due to hotel availability, we cannot guarantee the hotel will honor these requests.**

No exceptions will be made regarding our refund policy. For this reason, we recommend travel protection.

CANCELLATION POLICY: We at Jefferson Tours and Charters understand that at times, due to uncontrollable circumstances, it may become necessary to cancel a tour. In the event that cancellation does become necessary, the following policies will apply:

- 1) Jefferson Tours and Charters will have to charge any non-recoverable expenditures made on behalf of the participant at the time of cancellation. These costs would be for tickets, meals, hotels, etc. Hotels require a rooming list and full payment 60 to 45 days prior to arrival and show tickets are often purchased 60 days in advance. Many times, these monies are entirely non-refundable. In addition to any non-recoverable expenditures, there will be a \$10 per person handling fee to cover the cost of postage, processing fees, faxes, and long-distance telephone expenses. Cancellations made less than ten (10) business days prior to departure will be subject to the entire cost of the tour if a replacement cannot be found. Once the tour departs, no refunds will be made. Refunds are not given for any meals or attractions, etc, in which the travelers does not participate while on tour.
- 2) **Please note that we are unable to transfer funds to another tour if non-recoverable expenses have been made on your behalf on the tour you originally reserved.**
- 3) Refund checks will be processed at the end of each month. Please allow sufficient time after the tour returns to audit all hotel and attraction charges. At that time, we will make every effort to return any monies possible. If you have not received your refund 30 days from the return date of the tour, please call our office.
- 4) Refunds of monies paid on airline, cruise, or train tours will be made in accordance with the policy of the specific conveyance.

- 5) No refunds will be made for cancellations or other service interruptions due to the weather or other factors beyond Jefferson Tours and Charters' control.
- 6) In certain instances Jefferson Tours and Charters may cancel a tour. When this occurs, our travelers have the choice to either transfer their deposit to another tour or receive a full refund. Please note tour deposits are paid directly to hotels. Jefferson's process for these refunds is 30 days.
- 7) Please note that we do not refund credit card transaction fees for payments charged to credit cards. We are sorry for any inconvenience.

No exceptions will be made regarding our refund policy. For this reason, we recommend travel protection.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: We at Jefferson Tours and Charters recognize the need to protect your health, property, and trip investment. But what if something prevents you from continuing your tour and you are miles away from home? While it doesn't happen frequently, travel insurance protects you from the dreadful experience of paying for return home transportation, hotel accommodations, food, and medical costs, should you need it, out of your own pocket.

Protect yourself so you won't have to pay for things you didn't plan. Travel insurance, like the policies from Arch RoamRight, can provide peace of mind during your away time. There are a variety of plans available:

- Pro Plus Plan
- Cancel Flex Plan
- On Trip Plus Plan

Jefferson Tours and Charters recommends that you purchase insurance before traveling on any vacation. We have more information available on the levels and costs, so please ask how to purchase it.

However, if you choose not to purchase travel insurance, please understand that Jefferson Tours and Charters will not be held liable for your expenses and will not compensate you if you are detained from traveling at any point of your trip, including the start, or at any point in between. You should also be aware that your personal insurance may not be accepted in some parts of the country, or in foreign countries like Canada where we occasionally travel.

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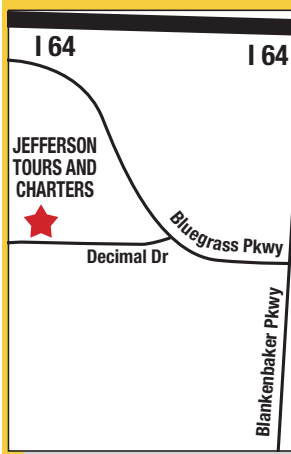

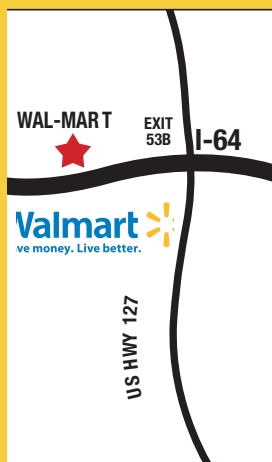

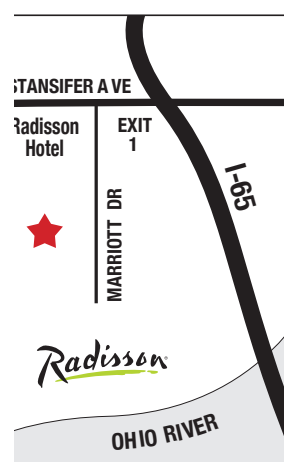
