

This afternoon, we ride the thrilling Niagara SkyWheel. After lunch on our own, we get an exciting, close-up view of this great natural wonder of thundering, churning waters as we take a boat ride on the Hornblower,

Canada's most iconic experience. Tonight, we have included dinner at the Queen Victoria Restaurant. What a view! What memories! Overnight same hotel.

Dav 3 - American Falls – Luna Island – Goat Island - Cave of the Winds - Power Vista Museum – Butterfly Conservatory – Greg Frewin Dinner Theater - After an included breakfast, we depart with a local guide on a day excursion that takes us back to Niagara Falls, New York for a visit to the American Falls. We will see Luna Island, Cave of the Winds, and Goat Island, which offer spectacular views from the edges of the falls. We will also visit the Power Vista Museum. This is an interactive museum featuring the history of electrical power generation at Niagara Falls. After lunch on own, we travel back to the Canadian side of the falls where we will be amazed at the Butterfly Conservatory. This magical attraction features over 2,000 colorful tropical butterflies floating freely among lush, exotic blooms and greenery. Tonight, we have included the popular Greg Frewin Dinner Show. Greg Frewin has appeared on the world's top stages, such as the Flamingo Hilton, Caesar's Palace, and the Tropicana in Las Vegas, and has been featured in over 35 television shows worldwide. Overnight same hotel.

Day 4 - Welland Canal Museum – Chocolate FX – Niagara-on-the-Lake – Winery Tour – Floral Clock - After an included breakfast, , we stop at Welland Canal, for a look at this great engineering feat. The canal is a series of seven lift locks and one regulating lock and is a manmade waterway system to compensate for the 326.5 ft. drop between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario. The locks can lift huge ships as if they were toys. Next, we visit Chocolate FX, Niagara's largest chocolate factory. We'll learn about the candy marking process and have the chance to purchase delicious chocolates to take home. This afternoon, we stop for lunch on our own and shopping at Niagara-on-the-Lake. This historic town captures attention with its Georgian and Victorian styled buildings. It was once the capitol of Ontario and a military standpost of the British. Afterwards, we have scheduled a winery tour and tasting – a great introduction to winemaking excellence. We make a photo stop at the Floral Clock before returning to our hotel. Overnight same hotel.

Day 1 - Charlottesville, Virginia - Today we drive through the Blue Ridge Mountains, over the Virginia line and into the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia. Crimson barns, lush orchards, and quaint towns dot Shenandoah, a patchwork of greens and golds. Our hotel accommodations will be in Charlottesville.

Day 2 - Jamestown Settlement - Yorktown -American Revolution Museum - This morning we depart our hotel and travel to Jamestown, Virginia, the first permanent English-speaking colony in North America. We'll experience life as it was in the old days of the colony and have a chance to board the ships in which the colonists braved the open seas - the "Susan Constant," "Godspeed," and "Discovery." Next, we visit the American Revolution Museum at Yorktown, which celebrates the American victory over the British that ended the Revolutionary War. This museum depicts the history of the war from the Boston Tea Party to the British surrender at Yorktown. After our tour, we check into our hotel for the next two nights in Williamsburg, Virginia.

Day 3 - Colonial Williamsburg - After an included breakfast, we will tour Colonial Williamsburg. The historic area includes 88 original buildings, shops, and homes, which have been meticulously preserved and restored. Your admission to Colonial Williamsburg includes shuttle transportation which will allow you to take your time and get on and off the shuttle bus at will. You will be able to tour the homes, church, and capital, and browse through the stores in Merchants Square. Overnight same hotel.

Day 4 - Thomas Jefferson's Monticello – Charlottesville, Virginia - After an included breakfast, we travel to Charlottesville. This afternoon, we visit Monticello, Thomas Jefferson's home from 1770 until his death. The tour includes the principal rooms of the house, which contain the statesman's furniture and personal effects. We overnight in Charlottesville.

Day 1 - Holland, Michigan - Our coach heads north into the "Great Lakes State" of Michigan to overnight in Holland.

Day 2 - Frederick Meijer Gardens – Windmill Island - After an included breakfast, we visit Frederick Meijer Gardens, a five-story glass enclosure housing exotic plants from around the world. Also featured are over 70 bronze sculptures by international artists, including Leonardo da Vinci's 24-foot horse. This afternoon, we visit Windmill Island, which features canals, a drawbridge, and a miniature Dutch village. Extensive tulip gardens surround the park's main feature, De Zwaan, a 1780's operating windmill from the Netherlands. Overnight same hotel.

Day 3 - White River Light Station – Silver Lake Dune Buggy – Traverse City, Michigan - After an included breakfast, we travel the shores of Lake Michigan and see the historic White River Light Station. Built in 1875, the lighthouse has been converted into a museum containing artifacts of Great Lakes nautical history. We continue to Silver Lake, where we will take a thrilling dune buggy ride across the Sahara desert-like sand dunes created by the Ice Age that formed the Great Lakes. We overnight in Traverse City.

Day 4 - Charlevoix Mushroom Houses – Michigan Lighthouse Cruise - After an included breakfast, we depart for a scenic drive to Charlevoix in Northern Michigan. We meet our local step-on guide for a tour that takes us through the city of Charlevoix past the famous



Mushroom Houses built by architect Earl Young. These fairytale-like "Hobbit houses" are known world-wide and can only be seen in the town of Charlevoix. After lunch on our own, we'll take a captivating Lighthouse Cruise. We'll be treated to awe-inspiring views of five Lake Michigan lighthouses, while taking in the stunning coastline views. Our expert guide will share with us history and maritime lore of shipwrecks, navigation methods, and fascinating historical accounts of these guardians of the Great Lakes. We overnight in Mackinaw City, Michigan.

Day 5 - Presque Isle Light Station – Frankenmuth, Michigan - After an included breakfast, we drive along Michigan's eastern border to view Presque Isle Light Station. The 1840 Lighthouse is one of the oldest on the Great Lakes and 1870 Lighthouse is the tallest light on the Great Lakes that the public may climb. The Keeper's House has been restored as a visitors' center, gift shop, and museum. We continue to Frankenmuth, to overnight. Dinner is included this evening.

Day 6 - Home - After an included breakfast, we journey back home with memories of Northern Michigan's natural beauty and historic lighthouses. **Meals: 5B, 1D**

Day 1 - Independence, Missouri - Anticipating the splendor of the Colorado Rockies, we board our motorcoach and travel through Indiana and Illinois into the "Show Me State" of Missouri. Our overnight accommodations will be in Independence.

Day 2 - Truman Library – Eisenhower Center – Salina, Kansas - After an included breakfast, we continue our journey westward. First, we tour the Harry S. Truman Library & Museum, which houses the president's personal and office papers. After lunch on our own, we visit the Dwight D. Eisenhower Center in Abilene, Kansas. We will visit his boyhood home, museum, and the Meditation Chapel, where he is buried. We overnight in Salina.

Day 3 - Denver, Colorado - After an included breakfast, we cross the great plains of Kansas into Colorado, where we leave the flat terrain behind us and head for the "Mile High City" of Denver. We overnight in the Denver area.

Day 4 - Denver City Tour – Air Force Academy – Garden of the Gods – Colorado Springs,

Colorado - After an included breakfast, a local guide will step aboard our motorcoach and provide a narrative history of the cosmopolitan city of Denver. In the afternoon, we travel to Colorado Springs, where we visit the Air Force Academy. Next, we drive through the colorful Garden of the Gods. This natural park is located at the base of Pike's Peak, where the Great Plains meet the Rockies. We will see massive, towering formations of red sandstone. We overnight two nights in Colorado Springs.

Day 5 - Pike's Peak Cog Railway - After an included breakfast, a thrilling day is ahead as we take the Cog Railway to the summit of Pike's Peak for a spectacular view of the Colorado Rockies. From Pike's Peak, it is possible on a clear day to see both Denver and the Sangre de Cristo Mountains in Southern Colorado and New Mexico. Overnight same hotel.

Day 6 - Royal Gorge – Black Canyon of the

Gunnison - After an included breakfast, we travel south to the Royal Gorge, where we begin the adventure of a lifetime. We take a breathtaking trek across its famous bridge that spans 1,053 feet above the Arkansas River. Next, we travel beyond the majestic Colorado Rockies as we visit the Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Monument. This lovely area is famed for its narrowness, its depth, and its gorge formations. The name Black Canyon comes from the dark-colored rocks in the area. We overnight in Montrose, Colorado.

Day 7 - Ouray – Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad - Breakfast is included at our hotel. Today we head deep into the mountains and national forests of the Colorado Rockies. We begin with a stop in Ouray, known as the "Switzerland of America." We continue to Silverton, an old silver mining town rich in history and legend. After lunch on our own, we board the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad and journey through the ruggedly beautiful mountains of the San Juan National Forest on our way to Durango, Colorado, where we overnight. GENERAL INFORMATION & TOUR CONDITIONS

Please read carefully before signing up for a tour. Your reservation constitutes acceptance of our policies.

TOUR COST INCLUDES: A trip with Jefferson Tours and Charters includes transportation, lodging, tours, local guides, entry and admission fees for all sightseeing, dining room tips for meals included in the itinerary, and the services of a professional Motorcoach Driver and Tour Director. **Prices are per person, based on double occupancy.** All tour prices are based on rates known at the time our catalog is printed and expected to be in effect at the time of departure. They are subject to increase if such rates change prior to departure.

NOT INCLUDED IN YOUR TOUR COST: Meals and tips other than those specified in the itinerary, maids, valet and laundry service, phone calls, room service, alcoholic beverages, and items of a personal nature. Gratuities for local step on guides and the Tour Director and Driver are not included. A recommended gratuity is \$6.00 per day, per passenger for the Tour Director and \$6.00 per day, per passenger for the Driver. Gratuities should be extended on an individual basis, not by passing a bag around as a group. Gratuities for international tours and cruises are not included. You will be given guidelines for recommended tipping in your final documents for all international tours and cruises.

RESERVATIONS: How far in advance do I need to make a reservation? We encourage you to make reservations as early as possible. A limited number of people can be accommodated on our motorcoaches. In addition, hotel reservations and ticketing are finalized 90, 60, or 30 days prior to the dates of service. Many people wait too long and are disappointed that the tour they want has been sold out.

DEPOSITS: Deposits are due within 10 days after making your reservation. Separate checks should be sent for each tour booked. Please DO NOT send cash in the mail. Balance is due within five (5) days of receipt of balance statement and itinerary.

LATE BOOKINGS: Our tour bookings are normally finalized 45 days prior to departure (with a few exceptions). There are some tours that we can still add on to after it has been finalized. We are happy to include you with the tour if there is availability. In these situations, we must receive full payment with your reservation, plus a late booking fee of \$25 per person. Unfortunately, late bookings can also bring about tour increases, which Jefferson Tours and Charters cannot control. Increases can occur in any tour component that is booked late, such as flights, hotels, cruises, and event ticketing. Should these prices increase, all information will be made available to the client and Jefferson Tours and Charters will receive client approval prior to payment.

CANCELLATION OF OUR TOURS: Please help us avoid canceling our tours prematurely. We have made reservations for hotels, attractions, and other suppliers that require contracts and deadlines for deposits and cancellation. Some of these are 90, 60, or 30 days prior to the date of service. If you are interested in a tour, please do not wait until the last minute to call us to see if it is going. If too many people wait, obviously we run the risk of having to cancel the tour due to lack of passengers booked to honor our contracts.

SAFETY MEASURES: At Jefferson Tours and Charters, the health and safety of our passengers and staff members is priority number one. We are implementing the strictest measures possible to create a hygienic, safe, and comfortable environment for our passengers. These measures include disinfecting and sanitizing areas of frequent contact such as handholds, restroom areas, armrests, entry areas, and surfaces in all vehicles during and after trips.

ROOMMATES: Each person making a reservation is responsible for finding their own roommate. When confirming your reservation for a tour, you should inform us if you have a roommate. Persons making a reservation without a designated roommate will be billed for the single rate. If either you or Jefferson Tours and Charters finds an acceptable person to share room costs, the cost of the tour will be reduced to the double rate and monies, if due, will be refunded to you. If a single room must be assigned because your roommate cancels (even at the last minute or while on tour), we must out of necessity, charge you the additional cost since the hotels make no allowances. If you prefer to have the privacy of your own room, you may do so for an additional charge as noted in our single price. The single rate does not include two seats on the motorcoach.

<u>PICK UP LOCATIONS</u>: In order to make your tour departure as convenient as possible, we pick up for our tours at the Jefferson Tours and Charters Office in Louisville; the Radisson Hotel in Clarksville, Indiana; the Wal-Mart in Frankfort; and the Marriott Griffin Gate Resort in Lexington. For groups of 20 or more, we will pick up at the location of your choice in any of our departure cities. For group pick-ups in locations other than our regular cities, there will be an additional cost per person. When making your reservation, it is important to give the correct departure location. No changes in pick up locations will be accepted after the itineraries are mailed, as departure timetables are established at that time.

LUGGAGE: How much luggage may I bring? For your convenience and to expedite movement, each tour participant is allowed one (1) large suitcase, not to exceed 22 x 10 x 30 inches in size and not to exceed 45 lbs. in weight. You must weigh and measure your bag after finishing your packing. In addition, each tour participant is allowed one (1) carry-on luggage (such as an overnight case or similar small bag) that you handle or carry-on yourself. This carry-on bag must remain in your possession while traveling. Please note that due to limited storage space, we are unable to accept luggage that exceeds that specified size or weight limitation. Although every precaution will be taken to protect your belongings, Jefferson Tours and Charters cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to baggage or belongings. We strongly recommend that you insure your baggage before leaving home. Please note that concealed weapons, or weapons of any kind are not allowed on the motorcoach or in the luggage compartments.

<u>CLOTHING</u>: How should I dress? We suggest that you travel as light as possible. Casual attire in wash and wear fabrics travel best. Slacks are very acceptable for ladies and sport shirts for gentlemen. Dress-up clothes are necessary only for specific occasions listed in the itinerary. Don't forget your umbrella or raincoat in case of showers. You should always take a sweater or jacket to use on the coach and comfortable walking shoes are a must for any tour. <u>GROUP COURTESIES</u>: Please be mindful of your fellow passengers and our staff. Group travel is a wonderful alternative to individual travel. We seek to provide a safe, clean environment for all of our travelers. It takes everyone in the group to make for a good tour. We ask that everyone be kind and courteous and keep on schedule. Please listen carefully to the Tour Director and/or Local Guide for instructions. We ask that everyone be able to keep up with the group. We reserve the right to refuse or discharge anyone we feel would be disruptive to the trip or harmful to themselves or others.

MEDICINES: If you are taking prescription medicines, be sure to take enough to last the duration of the tour. Sometimes it is very difficult to get a prescription refilled while in route. We highly recommend that you carry all medications in your purse, pocket, or in your carry-on, not in your large suitcase. It would be wise to have in your possession a list of all medications you are currently taking in case of an emergency. The coaches are not equipped to store medications that need refrigeration.

PHYSICAL DISABILITIES: Any disability requiring special attention or treatment, or hotel accommodations should be reported to Jefferson Tours and Charters when the reservation is made. We will request but cannot guarantee a handicapped room. Foldable wheelchairs and walkers are allowed on the tour, but must be stored in the luggage bays underneath the motorcoach. Wheelchairs and walkers are not provided by Jefferson Tours and Charters. Passengers intending to bring a foldable wheelchair or walker should notify Jefferson Tours and Charters at least 24 hours prior to departure. Unfortunately, the driver is unable to provide individual assistance to guests for walking, wheelchairs, or other personal needs. Travelers needing assistance must be accompanied by an able companion who can assist them. Some of our tours include attractions at high elevations; please consult your physician about possible health effects.

DELUXE MOTORCOACHES: Jefferson Tours and Charters uses only the most modern deluxe motorcoaches available. They are climate-controlled, have comfortable reclining seats, footrests, overhead storage racks, restrooms, public address systems, and large viewing windows. All of our motorcoaches have video systems for your added touring pleasure. We always try to take the most popular and scenic routes so that travel itself becomes an enjoyable part of your vacation. There is never any overnight traveling. All passengers are insured while traveling aboard Jefferson Tours' motorcoaches.

<u>SEAT ROTATION</u>: In order that everyone can enjoy a variety of views and have exposure to meeting other people on the tours, we rotate seats daily in a clockwise direction on all multiple day trips. One of the front seats is reserved for the Tour Director and will not rotate. In order not to show partiality among passengers, there can be no exceptions to our seating plan.

<u>COMPREHENSIVE ITINERARIES</u>: Jefferson Tours and Charters researches and plans each itinerary to include the "must see" sights of a given area as well as the little known, off the beaten path places that become the most memorable part of your experience. We try to ensure that you have an exciting, fun, educational, and the most enjoyable travel experience you have ever had. Jefferson Tours and Charters reserves the right to change or modify the itinerary to provide a smooth operation and ensure a successful tour. Should an attraction become unavailable during the year, we will substitute one of equal or better value.

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Occasionally an attraction will be changed for the sole purpose of improving the tour.

PROOF OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP:

- Photo I.D. (such as a driver's license) is a necessity on any trip.
- **Passports** A valid passport is required to enter Canada. A driver's license is no longer acceptable. Grandparents traveling into Canada with children must bring notarized written documentation of permission from custodial parent.
- Real I.D. Beginning May 7, 2025, every air traveler 18 years of age and older will need a REAL I.D. compliant driver's license or identification card, state-issued enhanced driver's license, or another TSA-acceptable form of identification at airport security checkpoints for domestic air travel. A REAL I.D. can be obtained at your local DMV.

<u>WAITING LISTS</u>: We take waiting lists on all tours, since we do have frequent cancellations. If the tour you request is filled, then we recommend that you sign up on our waiting list. As soon as a vacancy occurs, you will be notified that you are confirmed on the tour. All vacancies will be filled from the waiting list in the order in which they were received.

QUALITY ACCOMMODATIONS: Hotels are selected and continually monitored for their location, comfort, hospitality, and style. Careful planning, research, and experience are woven into the choice of each hotel. We maintain tight quality control on all our lodging accommodations so that your overnight stays will be an enjoyable part of your tour. Please note that most hotels have implemented a 100% non-smoking environment and charge a cleaning fee for smoking in a non-smoking room. We will send in your special requests on our rooming list to the hotel, for example, adjacent rooms, low floors, etc. However, due to hotel availability, we cannot guarantee the hotel will honor these requests.

CANCELLATION POLICY: We at Jefferson Tours and Charters understand that at times, due to uncontrollable circumstances, it may become necessary to cancel a tour. In the event that cancellation does become necessary, the following policies will apply:

No exceptions will be made regarding our refund policy. For this reason, we recommend travel protection.

- Jefferson Tours and Charters will have to charge any non-recoverable expenditures made on behalf of the participant at the time of cancellation. These costs would be for tickets, meals, hotels, etc. Hotels require a rooming list and full payment 60 to 45 days prior to arrival and show tickets are often purchased 60 days in advance. Many times, these monies are entirely non-refundable. In addition to any non-recoverable expenditures, there will be a \$10 per person handling fee to cover the cost of postage, processing fees, faxes, and long-distance telephone expenses. Cancellations made less than ten (10) business days prior to departure will be subject to the entire cost of the tour if a replacement cannot be found. Once the tour departs, no refunds will be made. Refunds are not given for any meals or attractions, etc, in which the travelers does not participate while on tour.
- 2) Please note that we are unable to transfer funds to another tour if non-recoverable expenses have been made on your behalf on the tour you originally reserved.

- 3) Refund checks will be processed at the end of each month. Please allow sufficient time after the tour returns to audit all hotel and attraction charges. At that time, we will make every effort to return any monies possible. If you have not received your refund 30 days from the return date of the tour, please call our office.
- 4) Refunds of monies paid on airline, cruise, or train tours will be made in accordance with the policy of the specific conveyance.
- 5) No refunds will be made for cancellations or other service interruptions due to the weather or other factors beyond Jefferson Tours and Charters' control.
- 6) In certain instances Jefferson Tours and Charters may cancel a tour. When this occurs, our travelers have the choice to either transfer their deposit to another tour or receive a full refund. Please note tour deposits are paid directly to hotels. Jefferson's process for these refunds is 30 days.

No exceptions will be made regarding our refund policy. For this reason, we recommend travel protection.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: We at Jefferson Tours and Charters recognize the need to protect your health, property, and trip investment. But what if something prevents you from continuing your tour and you are miles away from home? While it doesn't happen frequently, travel insurance protects you from the dreadful experience of paying for return home transportation, hotel accommodations, food, and medical costs, should you need it, out of your own pocket.

Protect yourself so you won't have to pay for things you didn't plan. Travel insurance, like the policies from Arch RoamRight, can provide peace of mind during your away time. There are a variety of plans available:

Jefferson Tours and Charters recommends that you purchase insurance before traveling on any vacation. We have more information available on the levels and costs, so please ask how to purchase it.

However, if you choose not to purchase travel insurance, please understand that Jefferson Tours and Charters will not be held liable for your expenses and will not compensate you if you are detained from traveling at any point of your trip, including the start, or at any point in between. You should also be aware that your personal insurance may not be accepted in some parts of the country, or in foreign countries like Canada where we occasionally travel.
